Reports:

- 1) Presidents report – Monkey Wrench has applied for a 4:00 AM liquor license. See New Business item #13.
- 3) Secretary - no report
- 4) Treasurer – account updated totals were reported.
- 5) Officer Jeff Artman reported that police activity and crime were at normal levels.
- 6) Darrin Riddle reported from compiled crime statistics that crime was back to seasonal normal levels.

Ongoing Items:

- 6) OH Banners – The Board voted to have Rick Goldberg proceed with collection pledged funds from banner donors and proceed with a printing order.
- 7) Newsletter – Annual Ads need to be renewed. Josh agreed to contact the advertisers.
- 8) Chuck Burke announced that the City Council has tabled any further discussion regarding Wayside and shelters in general until the City develops Licensing and Regulation guidelines. This indicates that the City does plan to license and regulate homeless shelters in Louisville.
- 9) Andi Hannan reported that “Slice of the Highlands” event planning is proceeding well.
- 10) Rick Goldberg informed that JCPS has now twice turned down request for a drinking fountain at Patterson Park.

- 13) The Board voted to draft a letter to the Liquor Board objecting to the Monkey Wrench request for a 4:00 Am liquor license. A copy of the original agreement executed By Monkey Wrench agreeing NOT to seek a 4:00 AM license will be included.
